<u>A DEVOTIONAL</u> FOR MEN ON THE GO

SIMPLICITY OF PRAYER

"Lord teach us to pray," asked the disciples of Jesus. They asked because they knew EVERYTHING ELSE ABOUT HIM WAS DUE TO HIS PRAYER LIFE. His personal magnetism--his eloquence--his mastery of every situation--his power and strength.

Prayer was one of the most characteristic things about Him. He rose early--a great while before day ... he lingered in the late hours--after others had retired--to pray.

He maintained constant--conscious touch with His Heavenly Father. This was the secret of His life. When we follow Him in His prayer life-we tap the *secret of His resources*. This is incumbent upon every Christian man.

Some men do not pray--because they think they do not know how. This is dead wrong. *Prayer in its essence is as natural as breathing*. It is instinctive as a father-son relationship ... as natural as turning to a kind father: seeking his counsel--his strength--his aid.

IT IS UNFORTUNATE--PITIABLE--WHEN MEN MAKE OF PRAYER A PECULIAR RELIGIOUS EXERCISE--demanding special language-special forms...when they turn it into a formal--liturgical thing. That is appropriate for public prayer...it is foreign to real private--personal prayer.

Three things are paramount in prayer. They lead to *simplicity*--the key to real--effective--productive prayer. Prayer that will *make a difference in your life*--that will actually accomplish things!

First is this: GOD IS YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER! "When you pray say 'Our father'" was the first instruction the Lord gave. God is not some far-off--unreal--ethereal abstraction. God IS PERSONAL--like a father...with a father's love--a father's concern and interest--a father's willingness to help.

THERE IS NEVER ANY RELUCTANCE ON GOD'S PART TO BLESS MEN! Man's reluctance to come to God – seek his blessing and help--is the *only thing* that shuts out God's richest and best from him!

Second thing is: SEEK God's WILL – YIELD TO HIS WAY! Let God's Kingdom and righteousness be your primary interest. Do not be like a disobedient son in the home--in rebellion--wanting his own way--whining-- pouting if he does not get it. *Father knows best* is the rule in the Kingdom as well as at home.

Life will never be limited or confined--but enlarged and expanded for the man who submits to the rule of God in his life. This is the key to personal victory--maximum freedom--efficiency--productivity!

Third thing is this: Pray in Christ's name, not as some magic abracadabra--but approaching God *in the authority of Christ's sacrifice* on the Cross. By this sacrifice we have been reconciled to God. In this sacrifice, we have freedom of access before God's Throne.

CHRIST IS THE WAY TO GOD!

Take time daily to spend with your heavenly Father. You will reap rich--immeasurable dividends. "Men who kneel before God can stand up to anything!" BIG--MEN--STRONG MEN--COME BY PRAYER! AMEN.

The High Call of Failure

"And let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we shall reap if we do not grow weary." Galatians 6:9

One of the highest callings in our lives is failure. But not only does failing not *sound* **good, it doesn't** *feel* **good either.** And yet, failure and progress go hand in hand. In most cases failure came before the great discoveries.

A failure or a mistake carries with it the opportunity to make a course correction to get us back on the right track. Those who persevere have learned this lesson well. They have developed an endurance and an attitude that says, "I'll never give up."

Have you ever seen James Earl Jones in the *Field of Dreams*? Remember in the voice of Mufasa, the father lion in *The Lion King*, or the voice of Darth Vader in the *Star Wars* films? The voice behind those characters was that of James Earl Jones. He's won three Emmy Awards, two Tony's, a Golden Globe and a Grammy.

But it wasn't always like that for James Earl Jones. At age 14, he stuttered so much that he never spoke in class. He was awkward, shy and a loner. The trauma of a move created such insecurity for him that he found it difficult to talk without stuttering. He began to communicate with others thorough notes.

Then one day his teacher asked him to read a poem out loud in front of his classmates. This took courage, but when he overcame his fear and began to read, the words started to flow. He liked reading aloud and wanted to do more. So, he practiced again and again. Through his speaking ability he won competitions and eventually a college scholarship. For years, he worked playing small roles in off-Broadway productions and supported himself as a janitor. But he never, never gave up. He admits that what he learned through his early disappointments and failures played a major role in who he is today!

Failure will be a part of your life at some time, perhaps in your relationship with a sibling, parent, at work, at church or in a dating relationship. We can either live behind our failures or beyond them.

Let's look at some heroes who have lived beyond them.

Have you ever fallen flat on your face? Probably. But have you done it on cold, hard ice? Probably not. Dan Jensen fell. He fell not only in the 1988 Olympics, but also in the 1992 Olympics. Then in the 1994 Olympics, he leaned over a bit too far and his hands brushed the ice. That cost him a medal! He had one last event to skate in--the 1000-meter race. It wasn't really his specialty event. He didn't feel good. Seven competitors had recorder better times than he. And this would be his last Olympic race. He won! And he won it in world record time. Dan Jansen wouldn't give up. He didn't allow discouragement to rule him.

Perhaps you feel as through you've really messed up. You've made some major mistakes. Have you considered how God can take this and bring some good out of it? It is possible.

Alexander Fleming was a research physician who appeared to make a mistake one day. He left a window open and some mold blew in that contaminated a bacteria culture in a dish. He could have thrown his hands up in frustration and discarded the contaminated dish. Instead he decided to observe what would happen to the bacteria. Something did! The mold produced a substance that prevented staphylococcus growth. He named the substance penicillin. It has healed millions. A mistake? Yes. A failure? Not in this case.

You will continue to fail as you go through life. Learn from your failures. Don't give up. And keep in mind that there is only One person who has never failed. He can help you with yours. His name is Jesus. **Amen.**

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

What are some of the failures you face today? Are you beating yourself up for a failure that God wants to turn into an opportunity? Would you be willing to give Him a chance? Amen.

Then, you can align your priorities for the coming day with the teaching and commandments that God has placed upon your heart.

God wants your undivided attention, not the leftovers of your day. And if you haven't already done so, form the habit of spending quality time with your Father in heaven. Ten New Holiday Etiquette Rules

Yes, it's almost that time of year! While some holiday traditions such as trimming the tree and hanging lights haven't changed that much, almost every other long-held custom has evolved. Your church newsletter staff added a few tips in this issue to enlighten you. Enjoy!

1. It is okay to send e-greeting cards.

"Many people send online cards because they want to be green and save time and money," says Lizzie Post, great-greatgranddaughter of Emily Post and co-author of *Emily Post's Etiquette, 18th Edition*. "There's no reason you can't do it, though most of us still love receiving cards by mail." It's fine to split your list, too, sending traditional cards to some people (such as your Internet-averse grandma) and e-cards to others. But avoid sending bulk emails, which may end up in junk mail folders (and feel less personal, anyway).

2. You can skip sending a holiday newsletter.

"It used to be standard to tuck these into cards, but this tradition is waning, perhaps because we're updated year-round via technology," says Rosalinda Randall, an etiquette consultant based in San Francisco, CA. If you do send a newsletter, keep it upbeat and brief (one to two pages max), not overly detailed (mention you had surgery, for instance, but not your difficult recovery) and send only to people who are genuinely interested in your family's news. You can also send it as an email attachment or a Facebook note in which you tag the people you'd like to read it.

3. Online invitations are okay for many holiday events.

"Evite and similar services are fine for casual parties," says Randall. "It also makes it easy for guests to respond immediately." If your event is formal or you want to make it feel more elegant, send invitations the old-fashioned way. "Getting something hand-addressed in the mail makes people feel special and sets the tone for your party," says Randall.

4. You can toast with water and without clinking glasses.

"It's a misconception that it's impolite to toast with water," says Post. If someone proposes a toast and you don't drink, "lift a glass of water or whatever's on the table in front of you," says Post. And did you know any guest can make a toast? Just keep it brief, thank the host for bringing everyone together, raise your glass and sip. As for the final step, clinking glasses is fun but optional; actually, it's never done at super-formal events, says Randall.

5. Give the hostess a gift.

Bringing a small present whenever you go to someone's house is still a good idea, says Post. If you know your hosts well, bring something that suits their interests, such as an upscale bottle of olive oil for cooks and a set of herb seeds for gardeners. If you don't know them well, opt for chocolates, jams, candles, decorative soaps, pretty napkins or small serving pieces they're not likely to own, like canapé forks. No need to spend a lot, though. "It's not about the price. It's about showing your gratitude for being invited and for your host's hard work," says Grosso.

6. Re-gifting is okay in *some* circumstances.

While this practice causes some etiquette experts to cringe—"You're supposed to accept a gift with the generosity of spirit in which it was given. Re-gifting kills that," says Post—others admit there are ways to pull it off tactfully. For one, the item must be **brand new**. For another, you can't pass a present to someone who knows the original giver. You also must remove all traces of tags and cards. Finally, never re-gift something that was personalized or handmade. On the other hand, it's fine to give away a duplicate or wrong-sized item if you come clean by saying something like: "I received this as a gift, and I already have one/can't use it. Would you like it?" Just don't pawn it off as something you bought especially for that person.

7. You don't have to rush out to buy something for someone who's unexpectedly given you a gift.

Almost everyone has been in the awkward position of receiving a present when you don't have one for the giver. "Be gracious, say 'thank you' and leave it at that," suggests Randall. "Don't claim you forgot your gift for her at home or it's on back order. The person will know you're lying and that'll hurt her feelings even more." Instead, write a thank-you note and pick up a little something for her next event, like her birthday or a gathering at her house.

8. Be selective about what you share on social media during holiday-party season.

A well-meaning "thanks for the great party last night" or a photo of the revelry posted on Facebook or Twitter can upset people. "What if your host didn't invite someone and doesn't want them to know there was a party? Or you embarrass someone with certain photos?" says Post. "It's not appropriate to scoop your host's event. She may not want to feel like you're a roving reporter." Besides, isn't it better to live in the moment and just enjoy the party?

9. It's fine to say "Merry Christmas" or "Happy Chanukah."

While "happy holidays" is never wrong, most etiquette experts agree that celebration-specific wishes are acceptable because they're "simply greetings of the season," says Randall. "Most people will respond in a positive way, even those who don't celebrate these holidays." But if anyone's offended by your greeting, offer a quick apology and move on.

10. A handwritten thank-you card is the best way to show your appreciation.


This rule is so old, it's new again. "These cards make the recipient feel good because you took the extra care to write it," says Grosso. Keep your message to a few sentences: Thank the person for the gift, mention how you'll use it or how thoughtful she is and sign off. If you open a gift in front of someone and thank them in person, it's not necessary to write a note, though it's always a kind response. Emailed thank-you notes are okay if it's your main form of communication with that person, but nothing beats an old-fashioned card.

The History of Veterans Day

As we prepare to celebrate Veterans Day 2016, here is a brief history as to why we celebrate veterans of wars fought by the men and women of the United States of America.

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War, then known as the "Great war". Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning the following year, November 11th became a legal federal holiday in the United States



in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars.

This celebration for veterans has undergone numerous changes:

In 1954, after lobbying efforts by veteran's service organizations, the 83rd U.S. Congress amended the 1938 act that had made Armistice Day a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans." President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the legislation on June 1, 1954. From then on, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

The next development in the history of Veterans Day occurred in 1968. At this time, Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill. Veterans Day would become one of four federal holidays celebrated on a Monday. This bill sought to ensure three-day weekends for federal employees. The new law set the observation of Veterans Day on the fourth Monday in October; the first Veterans Day under the new law was Monday, October 25, 1971. However, with this change of date confusion was ensued, as many disapproved of the change, and continued to celebrate the holiday on its original date. Many felt the original date of the celebration had historical and patriotic significance to many Americans. In 1975, then President Gerald R. Ford signed into law a bill returning Veterans Day back to its original celebration date, starting in 1978.

Celebrating Veterans Day around the world:

Britain, France, Australia and Canada also commemorate the veterans of World War I and II on or near November 11th. In the United States, there is a wreath laying ceremony held each Veterans Day at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery; parades and other celebrations are held around the country. Also, Veterans Day should not be confused with Memorial Day, which does happen. Memorial Day (the fourth Monday in May) honors American service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle, while Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans, living or dead but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

Here at Union Baptist Church, we salute all of our veterans and thank you for your service. We send out a special salute to **our oldest living veteran**, **Bro. George Hill**, who celebrated his 101st birthday this past May 2016.

May God's blessings be with all of our current military service members, wherever they are serving.

When the news was received, there were prayers, shouts and songs of joy as many people fell to their knees and thanked God.

Blacks have gathered in churches annually on New Year's Eve ever since, praising God for bringing us safely through another year.

When Christmas came to Kennedy – An Inspirational Story

We were known in the markets of Zambia as Christmas. As our team of 12 walked through the stalls where vendors sold fresh mangoes, smelly dried fish, and other produce, they would call out to us, "Please give me Christmas. I also want Christmas!"

A year ago, our team leader's wife Moira wanted to bypass all the Christmas stress and clutter. She had read in Nehemiah 8:10, "Go home and prepare a feast, holiday food and drink; and share it with those who don't have anything: This day is holy to God. Don't feel bad. The joy of God is your strength!" (The Message). With that, Moira's dream to take Christmas to Zambian orphans and vulnerable children began. One by one, we had joined her dream for a Christmas like no other.

A tearful Moira told us about Kennedy after she had met him on a home-care visit with some Hands@Work Zambia volunteers. But what she said didn't prepare me for my own encounter with him.



At first glance, Kennedy could draw a gasp - a 12-year-old boy so emaciated, with open sores on his frail body, folded up like an accordion. But that wasn't what commanded my attention; it was his eyes. His eyes mesmerized me. I was transfixed by his clear, wise gaze. Here was a boy who, in his 12 short years of life, knew more emotional and physical pain and loss than many know in a lifetime. But his eyes spoke of hope. Hope in something much bigger than his tragic circumstances. And that's how Christmas came to Kennedy.

It was New Year's Eve and the sky was perfectly clear. The sunset was exquisite and the stars were a canopy in the sky. We came to the village of Makululu, a shantytown of 60,000, to show the Jesus Film.

Before the film started, some of us went to Kennedy's home. Kennedy was an orphan. His parents had died of AIDS and he was living with his grandmother. Kennedy spent most of his days sitting in his "folded up" position, watching the world with those penetrating eyes. His grandmother's wish was a wheelchair for Kennedy so he could go to school. Everyone else knew he was too sick to ever use a wheelchair. That night, as we walked towards his mud hut, Kennedy sat as if he were waiting for something special to happen.

The grandmother rushed to create comfortable seating for her visitors, and as I sat down on the stool provided for me, God did something hilarious. He sent a bug "a really big bug" bigger than the dragonflies that flew around us. For some reason, this particular bug decided to dive-bomb my head. I screeched an unprofessional, unpastoral screech and quickly covered my head with the neck of my jacket.

At first I heard it and then I saw it. Those dancing eyes and serious face broke out into a melodious laugh. Kennedy threw back his head, and laughed and laughed. This boy with crystal-clear eyes, whose body was wracked with pain, was also a typical junior high boy who loved to laugh with others at their misadventures.

Kennedy's grandmother brought him on her back wrapped in a chitenji to the Jesus film that evening. They had also come to view the film the night before and both had prayed to receive Jesus. That night, during the scene of Jesus healing the lame man, I felt compelled to reach my hand towards Kennedy, and without touching him, I prayed that the same Jesus who 2000 years ago performed miracles for young and old, would reach out and transform his life. Several days later, our team leader arranged for us to take Kennedy to a doctor in the city of Kabwe. The *Christmas 12* waited for the likely verdict of Kennedy being HIV-positive. **I kept praying for a miracle.**

Then we heard the words, "He's not HIV-positive! He's negative. And the doctor believes that, with surgery, Kennedy will walk again." As we bounced our way back to the village along the rough roads, silent prayers went up to our amazing God, who can do the impossible. We had witnessed a miracle. Christmas had come to the village of Makululu and to Kennedy. The flicker of hope that I had seen in his eyes at the beginning was now a bright light. Not only was there a future and a hope for him in his medical condition, he was now a child of the King "Prince Kennedy."

Merry Christmas, Kennedy. Thank you for teaching all of us that the God of Christmas 2000 years ago is still mighty, powerful, and loving. For as much as Kennedy received the gift of eternal life and hope for a future, those of us who had the privilege of being in his presence were reminded of the true meaning of Christmas. "Peace on earth and good will to all!"

THE REAL MEANING OF CHRISTMAS

The real message of Christmas is not the gifts that we give to each other. Rather, it is a reminder of the gift that God has given to each of us. It is the only gift that truly keeps on giving.

God's gift was foretold by the prophets and came to us in the humblest of wrappings. What would you think if you saw a gift under your Christmas tree that was wrapped in newspaper and tied up with string? At first, you would

probably assume that a guy wrapped it. But think about God's gift to us. Jesus was not born in a palace of gold; He was born in a stable. He was clothed with rags. He was laid in a feeding trough. Yet these things do not, in any way, diminish the story of Christ's birth. If anything, they help us realize the great sacrifice God made for us. God's gift to humanity, the ultimate gift of eternal life through His Son, Jesus Christ, came in the simplest and humblest of wrappings.

We don't deserve this gift. At Christmas, we give gifts to those whom we care about, who have been kind to us over the past year, or who have given us a gift first. We don't give gifts to the person who has slandered our name or to the angry neighbor who never has a kind word to say. Yet God gave us His gift when we were His enemies. He didn't give this gift to us because we deserved it. In fact, it was just the opposite. The Bible tells us, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8 NKJV).

The gift tells us something about the giver. When God decided to give us the gift of eternal life, it wasn't something that He just thought of on the fly. Long before there was a town called Bethlehem, a garden called Eden, and a planet called Earth, a decision was made in eternity that God would send forth His Son, born of a woman, made under the law, to redeem those that are under the law. Make no mistake about it: this gift that God has given to us was the most sacrificial thing He possibly could have offered.

So Christmas isn't about those gifts that you have under your tree right now. All of those things will be gone one day. All that will be left after this life is the human soul, and that will live forever. We will put so much stock in what we have, but this is all going to pass away. Life is about what happens beyond the grave. Life is about knowing the God who made you and who gave you the greatest gift you will ever receive.

THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Comforter that Jesus Christ promised to his Disciples is here. The Comforter better known as the **Holy Spirit** is given by God our heavenly Father to all who spiritually believes Jesus is their Lord and Savior.

The Holy Spirit's purpose is our spiritual counselor in the physical absence of our Lord, but spiritual absence of our Lord is not so. The Holy Spirit and the Spirit of God are synonyms and a reference to the third person of the Trinity. Here are some descriptions:

TITLES of the HOLY SPIRIT

- One Spirit His Unity Ephesians 4:4
- The Lord the Spirit His sovereignty 2 Corinthians 3:18
- Spirit of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Knowledge Omniscience Isaiah 11:2
- Spirit of Might Omnipotence Isaiah 11:2
- Spirit of Truth His truthfulness John 14:17
- Eternal Spirit His eternity Hebrews 9:14

He's Omnipotence (Job 33:4). The Omnipotence of the Holy Spirit is seen in creation. In Genesis 1:2, the Holy Spirit is seen hovering over creation; the Holy Spirit gave life to creation.

He's Omnipresence (Ps 139:7-10; John 14:17). In Psalm139, David exclaims that he cannot flee from the presence of the Holy Spirit; if he ascends to heaven, He's there; if he ascends into the depths of the earth, the Spirit is there also. Even if he could fly away swiftly, he could not escape the presence of the Spirit. In John 14:17, Christ taught the disciples that the Spirit would indwell them all. There is an affirmation of the Spirit's omnipresence.

He's Eternal (Heb. 9:14). The Holy Spirit is called the Eternal Spirit in this passage. Through the Eternal Spirit Christ offered Himself without blemish to God. Just as the Holy Spirit had a part in the birth of Christ (Luke 1:35), in the same way He also had a part in the death of Christ.

He's Holy (Matt.12:32). One important aspect of deity is that God is holy, entirely set apart and separated from sin and sinners. The most common name of the Spirit is Holy Spirit, indicating the third person of the Trinity who also possesses the transcendent attribute of deity.

He's Love (Gal. 5:22). The Holy Spirit is love and produces love in the child of God. This is a primary attribute that fills the temple of the believer when he/she is saved.

He's Truth (John 14:17). The Holy Spirit is termed the "Spirit of Truth" in John 14:17 and 15:26. Just as Christ was the truth (John 14:6) so the Spirit is the truth and leads people to the truth through the scriptures.

As ministry leader, part of my responsibility is to help to increase grow and maturity of the men of Union in God's word. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, I will continue to support the men in their spiritual awareness.

BY THE WAY ...

Did you know the book of Acts is sometimes referred to as the "Acts of the Holy Spirit?" The Holy Spirit is mentioned 50 times. Check it out.



Breast Cancer Symptoms

Breast cancer symptoms vary from person to person, so it's important to be familiar with your breasts so you know what "normal" feels and looks like for you. If you notice any changes in your breasts, tell your doctor.

Breast cancer symptoms may include:

- A lump or thickening in or near the breast or in the underarm area
- Enlarged lymph nodes in the armpit
- Changes in size, shape, skin texture or color of the breast
- Skin redness
- Dimpling or puckering
- Fluid, other than breast milk, from the nipple, especially if it's bloody
- Scaly, red or swollen skin on the breast, nipple or areola (the dark area of skin that is around the nipple)
- Nipple pulling to one side or a change in direction

These symptoms do not always mean you have breast cancer. It is important, however, to discuss any symptoms with your doctor, because they can also indicate other health problems.
